### Early Admission Program Agreement

The Early Admission Program (EAP) at the University of Texas at Arlington is available to applicants who wish to begin their college education following their sophomore or junior year of high school. Applicants who satisfy admission requirements may enroll in university classes while being concurrently enrolled in high school. University credit is awarded for courses that are completed with grades of A, B, C, or D. The Office of the Registrar keeps official transcripts which indicate the department, course number, course title, grade and semester hours earned. Students may request an official copy of their University transcript after their first semester or summer session. International students currently enrolled in U.S. high schools are eligible for admission as EAP students.

Admission to the **Early Admission Program** requires an SAT-I total score of at least 1050, a PSAT of at least 105, an ACT composite score of at least 22 or a PLAN score of at least 19. Applicants should submit the following:

- Admission application and \$35 application fee. The application fee for international applicants is \$50.
- EAP Agreement form (signed by the principal, the student, and the student's parent or guardian);
- Official high school transcript showing sufficient credits to be classified as at least a junior.
- Official SAT-I scores, or official PSAT scores, official ACT scores, or official PLAN scores. (Test scores posted on a high school transcript are considered official.)

A student who is admitted under the Early Admission Program:

- May enroll in at most two (2) UTA academic courses each fall or spring semester while being concurrently enrolled in high school, or up to two (2) courses during the summer; (see reverse for Preferred Early Admission Coursework).
- Must submit THEA\* or approved alternate assessment scores if these have been attempted prior to EAP admission. If you are exempt from the THEA, documentation for this exemption must also be submitted. If you are not exempt or have not attempted the THEA, we encourage you to do so while you are taking coursework at UTA.
- Must follow University rules and regulations.
- Is classified as an Undeclared major; Will be advised by the Honors Academy located in College Hall, Suite 100, phone (817) 272-7215.
- Must submit a final high school transcript showing final rank-in-class and graduation date.
- Is **not eligible** for financial aid.

An Undeclared major designation is intended to enhance advising. Students may select courses that will apply to their desired major. Following graduation from high school, students may change their major.
