

## Art and Art History

**POSITION:** Assistant Professor in Art History with a specialization in Asian or African art at the University of Texas at Arlington. Position start date August 2010.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** The Department of Art and Art History at the University of Texas at Arlington invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the Assistant Professor level in African or Asian art, preferably with a specialization in the pre-Modern era and a secondary area of expertise. Candidate must hold an earned doctorate and demonstrate an established/promising record of research and publication. One to two years of prior teaching beyond the graduate assistant level or professional experience is preferred. Applicant must be able to teach introductory and advanced courses in all aspects of his or her field of specialty as well as an introductory survey of non-Western art to total approximately five courses yearly. Candidate must be prepared to develop and teach new courses in a department with 50 full- and part-time faculty (art history, eleven areas of studio and art education) and undergraduate (BFA, BA) and graduate (MFA) programs for more than 800 majors. Candidate is also encouraged to contribute more broadly to academic programs across the University, such as the MA program in Humanities (art criticism and art history) and the PhD program in Transatlantic History.

The University of Texas at Arlington, part of the University of Texas system, is a full service research and teaching university with approximately 28,300 students. The University is located in the City of Arlington in the center of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, which has an ethnically diverse population and excellent cultural facilities. The Metroplex is home to several major internationally recognized museums and galleries (*e.g.*, Kimbell Museum of Art, Dallas Museum of Art, and Trammell and Margaret Crow Collection of Asian Art). The University has recently received a collection of 150 objects of African art. Candidate's research and didactic interests should reflect a commitment both to working with original works of art and to engaging with issues of theoretical and interdisciplinary importance.
