Residence Hall Building Information Sheet

General Building Information

NO SMOKING/CANDLES: All UT Arlington Residence Halls are non-smoking facilities. If you are of legal age to smoke, and choose to do so, please smoke outside of the building(s) 50 feet away from main entrances others need to use to access the building. Candles are also not permitted within any Residence Hall.

QUIET HOURS: To be respectful of conference staff and other conferences in the building, quiet hours will be from 9 p.m. until 9 a.m. Please keep noise down to a low level during these times, especially around the rooms, as people may be trying to sleep. All times outside of quiet hours are courtesy hours when you should be considerate of your neighbors in regard to noise.

APPLIANCES: We request that you use your electrical appliances such as hair dryers, stereos, etc., wisely and do not have more than one heavy appliance operating at one time. No cooking appliances are allowed.

ALCOHOL: Alcoholic beverages may not be possessed or consumed in the residence halls, even if the guest is of age.

DRUGS: The use, manufacture, possession, sale or distribution of any compound, preparation or mixture which contains one or more of the substances defined and regulated by the Controlled Substances Act, Article 4476-15, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, are prohibited from the entire campus.

OFFICE HOURS: The Hall hours will be posted outside of the office. You can check-out games, vacuums, brooms, pool equipment, telephone books, etc., from the office IF your camp organizer or leader allows you to. Toilet paper and trash can liners will also be available.

LAUNDRY: Laundry facilities are available for your use in each residence hall

MAINTENANCE: To report maintenance or custodial problems, please contact the front desk as soon as possible.

PETS: Due to health regulations, no pets are allowed.

PESTS: Residence Halls are exterminated on a regular basis; however, if you are having problems please contact the front desk.

TELEPHONES: There are no telephones or telephone lines in the rooms.

VENDING MACHINES: There are food & beverage dispensers located in each hall

Emergency Information

Fire Evacuation

Each room or suite door has an evacuation map sticker. Please take a minute to review your location on the map and find the available exits. If the alarm sounds, all occupants should immediately evacuate the building and proceed away from the building. Do not re-enter the building unless directed by emergency personnel.

Tornadoes

The National Weather Service is responsible for issuing weather warnings to the public. When weather conditions develop which may produce severe local storms, a WEATHER WATCH is issued. Two types of watches are issued and one warning:

- Severe Thunderstorm Watch is an alert for a thunderstorm with damaging winds or either sustained speed or gusts up to 50 knots (58 mph) or greater and/or hail of 3/4 inch or more in diameter.
- Tornado Watch is an alert that tornadoes are expected and implies that thunderstorm activity, usually severe, is expected also.
- Tornado Warning is when a tornado has been sighted or is indicated by radar.

When a Tornado Warning is issued, persons in the path of the storm should take the following immediate safety precautions. An outdoor siren will sound to alert those who are outside. You may also hear an announcement over the hall's PA system.

1. Move quickly to interior hallways, basements, or other designated areas. (Stay away from windows) Safe areas are designated in each residence hall by red signs with the image of a tornado.
2. Protect yourself by lying face down with your knees drawn up under you and your hands and pillow covering the back of your head.
3. After the danger has passed, listen to the staff for further instructions.

Safety Tips

- Never prop your door open
- Always lock your doors
- Don't give anyone your key or access card
- Never let strangers in the hall
- Be aware of suspicious persons and activities
- Never leave your things unattended
- Avoid walking alone at night
- Be aware of what is around you
- Know the evacuation routes of your building
- Report maintenance concerns to the hall office
