

UTA ACSM Lecture Attendance

Thank you very much for your support and interest in the 2011 Fall Semester UTA ACSM Lecture with Dr. Paul J. Fadel, Associate Professor, Department of Medical Pharmacology and Physiology at the University of Missouri. Your support for the ACSM lecture as demonstrated by announcing it in your classes, encouraging your students to attend, and the personal interest displayed by attending the lecture yourself are all greatly appreciated. There were 327 in attendance at the 2011 Fall Lecture which is the second highest total for the UTA/ACSM Lecture to the 365 in attendance at the Dr. Wendy Kohrt lecture in the Spring of 2011. The attendance at the last two lectures surpasses the previous record totals of 309 who attended the 2009 Fall lecture with Dr. Mindy Millard-Stafford and 302 who attended the 2010 Spring lecture with Dr. Jim Pivarnik.

For your information, UTA is normally one of five to six sites selected each semester for the Texas ACSM Lecture tour. The other sites usually include The University of Texas at Austin, the University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth, Texas A & M University, and selected medical centers. Consequently, I am greatly appreciative of our opportunity to be a regular part of this lecture tour. This semester, however, UTA was not scheduled for the TACSM Lecture Tour. Thus, our speaker presented at UTA only. Attendance at our lectures has generally been greater than the other sites. In fact, our average attendance at our UTA ACSM lectures (**183.5**) is usually greater than all of the other sites combined. **The total attendance at the 50 UTA ACSM lectures is 9,175 or an average of 183.5 attendees per lecture.**
