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Dear Students:

As we begin the fall 2009 semester, we are once again offering the **Allan Saxe Disabled Student Scholarship**. This prestigious scholarship is awarded each fall and spring semester to a student with a disability who excels academically at The University of Texas at Arlington as well as in community/leadership activities.

**Minimum qualifications are as follows:**

1. All applicants must be a first-time undergraduate student at UT Arlington.
2. All applicants must have completed at least 12 hours at UT Arlington to be eligible for this scholarship.
3. All applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA for a minimum of 12 hours completed at UT Arlington.
4. All applicants must be enrolled in a full load of classes (full time status is defined as at least 12 hours or more) and must maintain full-time status for the duration of the scholarship period.
5. All applicants must be in good standing with UT Arlington (e.g. not on probationary status).
6. Your application must be accompanied by two letters of recommendation from UT Arlington faculty and/or staff (see recommendation requirements form).
7. Your application must include a **500 word essay** (see application for specific topic).
8. For disability verification purposes, all applicants must be registered in The Office for Students with Disabilities.

Applications are available in the Office for Students with Disabilities (OSD) for your convenience or you can access information on our website at [www.uta.edu/disability](http://www.uta.edu/disability). If you experience difficulty, give us a call at 817-272-3364 and we will mail a copy to you. In addition, OSD will secure a copy of your transcript once we have reviewed your application for its completeness. **All application materials and letters of recommendation must be in our office by Monday, October 12, 2009 for your application to be considered complete.** The committee plans to award the \$500.00 (five hundred dollars) scholarship by the end of the fall 2009 semester.
