Program Overview

The program leading to the MA degree in criminology and criminal justice offers a comprehensive examination of the criminal justice system, with a special emphasis on criminal justice management. The curriculum is designed to balance theory and application in academic course work. Emphasis is placed on historic and current literature in the criminal justice field with the purpose of improving critical thinking and leadership skills. The program is intended for those already working in the criminal justice system and seeking upward mobility within that system.

The CRCJ department is home to nationally recognized faculty whose diverse areas of expertise allow students to receive a strong and well rounded academic experience. Experts in areas such as law enforcement, criminological theory, terrorism, and management, strive to challenge students while also caring for their academic formation. The department has a tradition of producing highly competitive criminal justice managers prepared for the challenges of employment with private, municipal, state, and federal agencies.

Classes meet Monday and Wednesday evenings

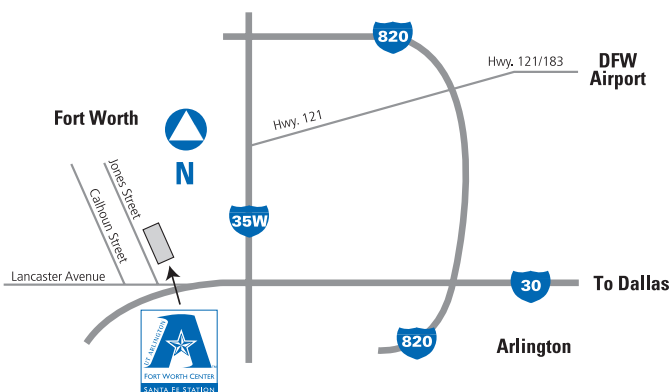
