**One of the most important archaeological sites of northern Greece!**

The small town of Vergina is within easy reach of Thessaloniki, and it bears excavations of great importance.

The first excavations here were carried out in the 19th century and were resumed in the 1930s, after the liberation of Macedonia, to be continued once again after the Second World War.

In 1977, M. Andronicos brought to light the royal tombs in the Great Tumulus of Vergina. The most remarkable of these was the tomb of Philip II, and its discovery is considered to be one of the most important archaeological events of the century. Since then, continuing excavations have revealed a series of significant monuments.

During a morning tour, we will visit the site and its exhibits, among which are some world-famous gold finds.
