Dear Dr. Spaniolo:

Thank you for your letter, dated May 1, 2013, regarding the institution's intent to enter into a dual degree program with the University of Dallas, effective fall 2013.

The proposed dual degree program is a five-year program (172 total credits) in which University of Dallas students will, at the completion of the program, earn two degrees:

- The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Physics from University of Dallas (UD); and
- The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Electrical Engineering from University of Texas at Arlington (UT Arlington).

Students will complete 114 credit hours at UD and 58 credit hours at UT Arlington. The signed Letter of Agreement states that the agreement will be in effect, pending notice of termination, through August 31, 2022 (ten years from date of approval signatures). Both institutions are SACSCOC accredited.
