

TEST 3 is in PKH 305 in class time, Thurs Nov 19

- The material covered on Test 3 is the same as that covered on the homework from §1.1 through §7.2 inclusive, with the main emphasis being on §4.1 through §7.2. (Homework is listed at my website: www.uta.edu/math/vancliff/T/F09 .)

- In style, this test will be very similar to Tests 1 & 2; meaning, part multiple choice and part show-work. There will be several choices of answer per multiple-choice question and, for each, only one answer will be the correct one. You should do rough work on the test or on paper provided by me. You should bring an allowed calculator (see 1st-day handout) & UTA photo ID & a 3" × 5" card with whatever you want written on both sides, but you do NOT need to bring a scantron form.
- When I write a test, I look over the lecture notes and homework which have already been assigned, and use them to model about 85% of the test problems (and most of them are fair game). You should expect 7-15 questions in total.
- A good way to review is to go over the homework problems you have not already done & go over Tests 1 & 2 & their solutions & make sure you understand all those questions very well by 48 hours prior to the test. (I'll have a few spare copies of Test 2 with me in class if you need one.) In the last 24 hours before the test, reread ALL the homework problems, skim through Tests 1 & 2, & skim through the lecture notes.
- Try to keep your eyes on your own work during the test. Cell phones should be out of sight and switched off. Textbooks should be under your own chair or out of sight.
- If you wish to leave the room during the test, you should ask permission first & turn in your test to me. Only in exceptional circumstances will I let you continue the test should you return. (So it is better to be 3 minutes late to the test, rather than ask to go to the bathroom during the test.) If you finish early but prefer to stay in the room, then you should NOT get out any work, book nor item, no matter what the subject matter is. Should you wish to leave the test early, then you may.
