

## General Information

The annual Summer Strings program at UTA provides young string players with at least one year of study on a string instrument an opportunity to improve their musical skills, gain a greater depth of musical knowledge, and develop new friendships with students from around the state.

Students participate in daily rehearsals, string sectionals, and classes in music theory, music literature and conducting. Students may also elect one private lesson for an additional fee. The activities of the week will conclude with a concert on Friday evening during which all six orchestras will perform.
