Join the School of Nursing faculty for a Mexico elective, N3347-002/N4655/N5370, *Cultural Variations in Healthcare: A Comparative Analysis of Two Cultures* (UTA students from **ALL DISCIPLINES** are welcome.), a two-week study tour and cultural immersion experience in the "City of Eternal Spring," - Cuernavaca, Mexico: a wonderful get-away from the hot DFW summer while you immerse yourself in the language and culture by living with a Mexican family. Absorb the Spanish language in small intense classes gauged to your language abilities (5 students/1 instructor) at the Universidad Internacional Center for Bilingual Multicultural Studies. Meet other students and professionals from all over the world. Special conferences provide information on the Mexican health care system, traditional medicine and selected values and beliefs about health and illness. Guided field trips to health care facilities and local cultural sites (Ballet Folklorico in Mexico City, the mercado, the zocalo, the Arts District, and a tour of historic Cuernavaca) provide a first hand view of day-to-day life. You will also have the opportunity through extra-curricular excursions to visit museums, pyramids, Acapulco, **Taxco (silver mining town)** and many other interesting Mexican sites.

Undergraduates enroll in N3347-002(3 hrs) or N4655 (6 hrs); graduate students enroll in N5370 for 3 credit hours. Cost includes UTA tuition for 3 – 6 credit hours, language classes, airfare and bus transportation from Mexico City, lodging and meals: approximately \$2,537(3CH) to \$3,907(6CH). Excludes weekend side trips to pyramids, Taxco (silver mining town) and other sites. Information on extracurricular excursions and approximate costs available.
