Admission Requirements

- **Texas RN Licensure**
- **Minimum GPA of 2.50 in required prerequisites**
- Transcripts of RN Students are evaluated with consideration of the Coordinating Board Field of Study Curriculum (FOSC) guidelines.
- Credit is given for all courses listed in the FOSC guidelines as transferable, as well as any additional courses that may be applicable for transfer (28 credits).
- **TOEFL Requirement:**
If the applicant's native / first language is not English and if he or she does not hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. Institution, the TOEFL exam is required for admission to the School of Nursing even if the student has met one of the stated UT Arlington University exemptions.
