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**CNR Goals 2006-2007**

During 2006-2007, the Center for Nursing Research had both infrastructure and faculty scholarship goals. CNR staff and the services they provided are enumerated in Appendix A. Assessment of goal achievement is summarized in Figure 1.

Tenure track faculty submit at least one proposal for funding. Two of the three tenure track faculty submitted a proposal for funding. Each was funded. They were:

1. Rugari, S. Qualitative description of the process of equine-facilitated psychotherapy and equine assisted psychotherapy. UTA REP, \$10,000.
2. Judkins, S. K. Primary Investigator. Continuation of Plaza Medical Center Research Grant: Determining Best Outcome Measures for a Jobs-to-Career Program at HCA Plaza Medical Center. \$40,000.

Update technology/infrastructure. In 2005-2006, in anticipation of the initiation of the BSN to PhD program, the CNR elected to transition to an all nursing student staff. With the graduation of the last international student in August, the decision was made to restrict employment to graduate nursing students. During the summer of 2006, 3 traditional entry PhD program students were employed, 2 BSN to PhD program students were employed and one undergraduate student with a PhD was employed. We anticipated employment from another 3 BSN to PhD program students. The BSN to PhD program did not attract the full complement of students and only 2 BSN to PhD students continued to work in the CNR. Three traditional entry students and one BSN student worked in the CNR during Fall and Spring.

In January 2007, the CNR employed one international student as the nursing student staff was too small to meet the demand for services. In Summer 2007, a fourth traditional entry student worked in the CNR as did an American Heart Association Intern (an undergraduate student from UT Dallas). In anticipation of reducing the number of nursing student staff members (from 3 to two traditional entry PhD program students; and from 2 to 1 BSN to PhD students), the CNR began recruitment of international students to work in the CNR.

In Summer 2007, the CNR enhanced its infrastructure by upgrading all of the computers in the CNR and in the CNR conference room. The teleform software program was upgraded and expanded and moved to a new server. The move to the new server created a

communications problem that slowed all of the teleform work. At the start of the Fall semester, that communications problem remained unresolved.

In 2006-2007, the CNR began actively using the statistical resources available through the UTA Office of Information Technology. Faculty and students who have used this service report satisfaction with it.

Support all faculty pursuing scholarship goals. The details of faculty scholarship are provided below and in the Appendices.

Support students in the PhD program and faculty working with these students. The detailed outcomes are provided below and in the Appendices.

Create a research collaborative among tenured and tenure track faculty. Two research collaborations were developed/supported: genomics translational research and simulation in nursing education. Funding to create a genomics translational research laboratory was obtained and space within Pickard Hall identified for it. A Science Director was employed. The research collaborations in simulation in education benefit from the creation and opening of the Smart Hospital™ in August 2007.

Support interdisciplinary collaborative research efforts. During 2006-2007, interdisciplinary activities yielded several proposals for external funding. They included (the bolded items achieved external funding)

## Faculty Development

A number of faculty received development awards from the Provost's Office. Dr. Jennifer Gray continued the scholarship accountability group that meets monthly. Attendance has average at about 6.

## Faculty Scholarship Grants

During 2006-2007, the CNR supported 27 applications for funding. Center support ranged from completing the “blue sheets” to writing the application. For detailed information about these applications, see Appendix B.

### Scholarship Objective: UTA School of Nursing Strategic Plan 2004-2007

The 2004-2007 strategic plan for the UTA School of Nursing has one objective related to faculty scholarship: Increase the number of faculty involved in scholarly activities. The objective has three outcomes. Table 6 presents these outcomes and the degree to which each has been achieved. In 2006-2007, the School of Nursing employed 15 tenured (12) and tenure track (3) faculty members, 14 full-time PhD prepared faculty on the non-tenure track, and 44 full-time MSN prepared faculty on the non-tenure track. One quarter of the full-time faculty on the non-tenure track hold the doctorate.

### Summary

There has been a substantial increase in the number of research proposals and the amount of research funding coming to the School of Nursing. However, only a few faculty members are actively engaged in research and research funding.

Educational grant activities (number of applications and funds sought) are markedly reduced from that of previous years. At least two factors associated with the reduction are

- the Association Dean for Research redirecting her efforts to research applications and research funding, and
- the request from UTA administration to temporarily cease preparing educational grant application budgets that required UTA commitment to pick up salaries of personnel supported on grant funds.

Three of the tenured faculty retired at the close of the 2006-2007 year. One of the tenure track faculty was awarded tenure. Only one faculty new to the School of Nursing was awarded tenure upon appointment. The School of Nursing starts the 2007 academic year with 10 tenured faculty.

One of the faculty on the tenure track left the university. Two of the newly employed faculty elected appointment to the tenure track. The School of Nursing starts the 2007 academic year with 3 tenure track faculty.

For scholarship within the School of Nursing to occur,

1. composition of the faculty must change so that there are more tenured and tenure track faculty and the proportion of non-tenure track faculty who are doctorally prepared increases.
2. teaching workloads for newly employed faculty on the tenure track must be limited to 6 units in the first year and no more than 9 units in the second year of appointment
3. teaching workloads for all faculty engaged in scholarship must be limited to 9 units
4. summer appointments to support faculty scholarship should be actively pursued
5. Salaries for all faculty appointments must be market competitive.
