# Resolution 22-01

*“U.C. the Need!”*

Whereas:	The E.H. Hereford University Center at UTA is the hub for many student activities, organizations, and events on campus.
Whereas:	UTA is Texas’ newest Tier One university, and the students deserve a top-tier facility. The current student union fee is no longer able to sustain the needs of our growing campus community.
Whereas:	Renovations and expansion of the entire University Center would further improve the experience and amenities available to students and student organizations.
Be It Therefore Resolved That:	A referendum be held during the next general student election to poll the student body on whether or not the student union fee shall be raised in order to renovate and expand the University Center.

Approved Referendum Text:

### Student Life and Community Initiative

*The E.H. Hereford University Center serves as the University of Texas at Arlington’s student union building, which is the hub of student life and engagement on campus. After 40 years without raising the Student Union fee, I agree to increase the UTA Student Union fee to the amount of \$150 per long semester (fall/spring) or \$75 per short semester (Summer I/II) to enhance, improve, and expand event and meeting space, dining space, and student lounge space with a concentration on inclusivity and green initiatives (LEED Silver standards). The fee increase shall not be implemented until the semester in which construction reaches significant completion.*

*“Student Green Fund on the Ballot”*

Whereas:	Resolution 19-05 Green for Green was approved by the Student Senate in April 2019 and to be implemented by UTA administration, the resolution must be on the ballot of the general election; and
Whereas:	According to Texas State House Bill 3353, "The governing board of an institution of higher education may charge each student enrolled at the institution an environmental service fee, if the fee has been approved by a majority vote of the students enrolled at the institution who participate in a general student election called for that purpose."; and
Whereas:	The Green Fund will provide resources to further the Sustainability Initiative on campus with awards to students, staff, and faculty for projects that model environmentally, economically, and socially sustainable practices in the campus community. The Green Fund will help implement sustainability initiatives such as solar panel installation, expanding the composting program, water filling stations, urban farm stand, campus master plan, student internships, promoting bike friendly campus by installing more bike racks and establishing a Bike Barn; and
Whereas:	In Texas, UT Austin, University of Houston, North Texas, Texas A&M, UTSA, and UT El Paso, have a Student Green Fund with an annual fee between \$6 and \$12.50.
Be It Therefore Resolved That:	A referendum be held during the next general election of Spring 2022 to poll the student body on whether or not the student Green Fund shall be implemented.

Approved Referendum Text:

## Student Green Fund

*A Green Fund is a student fee that goes toward campus sustainability projects. The Green Fund has already been implemented by other universities in Texas. I agree to implement a Green Fund to the amount of \$5 per long semester (Fall/Spring) or \$2.5 per short semester (Summer I/II) to support student-led programs that promote sustainability, renewable energy, waste reduction, and educational efforts such as conferences, and internships.*
