
Featured Public Show

The full moon in February will occur on February 10 around 6:33 p.m. local time (February 11 00:33 UTC). The moon will actually rise partially eclipsed. However, the most intense moment of the partial eclipse will be a few hours before the moonrise. Therefore, it will not be very noticeable for Texans.

A full moon occurs when the Earth is between the sun and moon. In this position the side of the moon facing Earth is completely illuminated by sunlight bringing extra light to the night sky on Earth. When in full phase, the moon rises with dusk and sets with dawn.

A lunar eclipse occurs when the Earth is in between the moon and sun. The moon enters into the Earth's shadow which makes the moon dark for a few hours. Earth's air, however, refracts some sunlight onto the moon's surface during the eclipse, making the moon appear a copper or orange color rather than dark black. In the simulated image above, the left side of the moon is tinted a dark red color due to a partial eclipse.
