BSW Job Announcement

Students hired for this position will be working under the direction of Dr. Zhen Cong on a project to study vulnerability and resilience to natural disasters and addresses topics about special needs, response to warnings, recovery, and social and health disparities etc.

Job Duties: Job duties will vary depending on the needs of the project. Tasks will include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Data collection by phone survey
- Data entry
- Data analysis
- Participating in team meetings

Position Details and Eligibility Requirements: 6 positions available - open to BSW students. Students do not need a recommendation letter from faculty - may just provide name (preferably for professor who taught their research course). Research Assistants (RAs) must be flexible, highly motivated, and able to work independently or collaboratively on tasks as needed.

To be eligible, students must

- Current student of the BSW program
- Strong interest in social behavioral research
- Strong Interpersonal skills
- Well- organized
- Comfortable Working on a team project
- Ability to work on campus (morning, afternoon, and evening shifts needed)
- Knowledge of APA, and familiarity with library database searches and conducting literature reviews is required

Opportunities

- Experience the research process first-hand
- Learn to use advanced data analysis software (SPSS)
- Be a team member of a federally funded grant project (National Science Foundation)

Compensation: This position is a paid position at \$9.09/hour for 10 hours/week and is slated to start in Spring 2019
